A message to our school from author Sally Doherty

Hi Richmond Avenue Primary and Nursery School,

My name is Sally Doherty and I'm the author of Toby and the Silver Blood Witches, suitable for ages 9-12.

It's about a twelve-year-old boy called Toby who is a young carer. Since his mum fell ill two years ago, he has forgotten how to enjoy life and just wants to stay at home and look after her. But mysterious things are happening in the building behind his garden hedge. And then a strange woman with a broken broom and a pet bat crash-lands in his attic. Toby becomes entangled in a magical adventure in which he discovers a secret city in the sky and he uncovers a sinister plot to experiment on witches. And along the way, he learns how to laugh again.

I live in Surrey, south-east England, with my husband and three-legged rescue dog called Jasper. I suffer from ME which is the same illness as Toby's mum. This means that I have to spend most of my time stuck at home. However, it also means that I have a lot of time to think up new stories and work through the plots. I'm currently writing the sequel to Toby and the Silver Blood Witches which is due out this year.






