Dear Parents and Guardians,

We're writing to clarify our policy on mobile phones at school following recent discussions. Whilst we understand the importance of communication, we have concerns about phones (including smart watches) being brought onto school grounds without permission.

Years R-4:

No mobile phones or smart watches on school premises. This includes the paths, fields and playground. We believe this fosters a distraction-free learning environment and promotes social interaction.

Year 5&6 students:

- May bring a phone to hand in to their teacher upon arrival, only if walking home alone. This requires written parental permission.
- **Phones must be turned off during school hours** as soon as pupils step through the gates and not turned on again until pupils have left the school site (ie *not* on the playground).
- **As a reminder,** children under 13 should not have Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook, WhatsApp or Tiktok.
- School is not responsible for lost or damaged devices.

Please note:

- Phones brought without permission will be confiscated and returned later, with possible additional consequences.
- Consider if your child truly needs a phone at school. Other arrangements, like being picked up, might be more effective.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in ensuring a safe and focused learning environment for all students. Please don't hesitate to contact us if you have any questions or require further clarification.
