Sports Premium Allocation: £15,800

DfE Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

To ensure appropriate frequency and quality of lessons in respect of our P.E provision.

Impact

- Minimum of 2 hours PE per week on offer for all pupils across the school
- Each lesson has a clear and progressive skill being taught
- Children can talk about what they are learning, why they are learning and where it fits in for each lesson, they take part in
- Use of SPSSA coach with a specific focus (invasion games – years 1 – 6) has upskilled teachers in being able to deliver these lessons confidently and independently.

DfE Key indicator 2: The profile of PESSPA (Physical Education, School Sport, Physical Activity) being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

To create more extra-curricular club opportunities for pupils across different age groups

COSTING:

£30 / night x 24 weeks = £720

SUBTOTAL £720

Impact

- Evidence of a wide range clubs being offered and attended
- SPSSA clubs within the school day (lunchtime KS2 dodgeball club/after school KS2 multi-skills club)
- Children can talk about clubs they have attended
- Broader offer of different sports (Before school KS2 tag -rugby club, KS1/KS2 athletics club, lunch-time cricket club)

To trial out new and innovative ways to get children more active, ensuring they have a clear understanding of the link between being healthy and an active lifestyle

Impact

Use of now press play across all subjects (pupils can be immersed into a story/activity using headphones, within class)

- Media evidence shows active learning taking place (Active learning is a link between maths and PE. Staff meeting in Feb 2024 for all staff to trial this idea with an expectation it is used at times within a maths topic)
- Staff and children can talk about when active learning has taken place
- Monitoring and informal drop in shows active learning is taking place
- Children can talk about the impact of active learning

To ensure new playground markings utilises the space on the playground effectively**

Impact

- Equipment was audited and any old/broken equipment has been replaced and new equipment ordered
- All staff are aware of the expectations of equipment and where it is stored
- Equipment that is ordered matches what is needed for overall PE provision across the school
- Playground markings are used effectively
- Playground leaders and sports ambassadors, trained by staff to lead games and activities at lunchtimes.

Impact

- Children have lots of activities and areas for calm during their play and lunch breaks. This leads to greater freedom and less behaviour incidents

Impact

- CPD is shown to be having an impact (lesson observations by SLT, joint year groups teaching together at Shoebury High School, Miss Goodrich undertaking swimming qualification)
- Monitoring of subject shows CPD has had an impact
- Staff can talk positively about how subject knowledge has improved due to effective CPD
- Team teaching (joint year group teaching) in terms of planning and delivery has been carried out
