1. Viking Timeline

Create a timeline showing key events during the Viking Age (e.g., Lindisfarne raid, settlement in York). Include 7–10 events, with short explanations and colour-code raids, settlements, and explorations.

2. Viking Longship Design

Draw and label a Viking longship. Add detailed annotations and explain how longships helped Vikings in war and trade.

3. Viking Life Diary Entry

Write a diary entry from the perspective of a Viking child. Add historical detail, Viking vocabulary, and describe feelings and daily struggles.

4. Norse Mythology Poster

Create a colourful poster about one Viking god or goddess (e.g., Thor, Odin, Freya). Compare two gods or include a short comic strip of a myth.

5. Viking Runes Activity

Write your name and a short secret message using Viking runes. Write a riddle or short poem in runes and create a decoding activity. Can you make your own runes?

6. Viking Invasion Map

Find out which parts of Britain the Vikings invaded and settled in. Shade these areas on a map and label 3 major Viking settlements.

Add arrows showing routes of invasions and write a short paragraph explaining them.

7. Compare & Contrast

Write a paragraph comparing life in a Viking village to life today. Think about housing, food, transport, and clothing. Compare and explain how Viking innovations influenced the modern world.

8. Make a Viking Menu

Imagine you are cooking for a Viking feast. Research Viking foods and create a 3-course Viking meal. Illustrate your menu with drawings or clip art. Add explanations about where the food came from.

9. Viking Weapon Fact File

Research and create a fact file about Viking weapons and armour. Research how weapons were made and compare them to those of other ancient cultures. Can you make one of the weapons?

10. Viking Interview Script

Write a script for an interview with a Viking explorer. Include emotion, historical vocabulary, and a setting description for the interview.

Find out which parts of Britain the Vikings invaded and settled in. Shade these areas on a map and label 3 major Viking settlements. Shade and label at least 3 major settlements (e.g., York, Dublin, Lindisfarne).

7. Compare & Contrast

Write a paragraph comparing life in a Viking village to life today. Think about housing, food, transport, and clothing. Write a paragraph comparing at least 4 features of Viking and modern life.

8. Make a Viking Menu

Imagine you are cooking for a Viking feast. Research Viking foods and create a 3-course with brief descriptions of each dish. Illustrate your menu with drawings or clip art.
